An online opportunity to learn about building your own aircraft

Homebuilders Week is an online opportunity to carry on the founding mission of EAA by sharing as much knowledge and information about building your own aircraft as possible in five days. We start on Monday, January 22nd, 2024, and end on Friday, January 26th, 2024. Each day, we offer six live webinars back-to-back, starting at 11:30 am central time and running every hour and a half until the last session at 7pm central. The topics cover a wide variety of areas of interest to anyone curious about building their own aircraft. January 27 BBQ Lunch and Program

Our Fourth Saturday BBQ Lunch and Program will be held on Saturday, January 27, from 11:00 am until 1:00 pm. The BBQ Lunch starts at 11:00 at our hangar at the Lincoln Regional Airport. If you are not familiar with our hangar's location, come to the airport and just follow the "EAA" signs.

The grill is hot from 11:00 a.m. until 11:45 a.m. when it shuts down, so come early. BBQ Lunch is \$10.00 for adults, \$5.00 for youth 17 or under (yep, we changed the youth age range to 17 and under), and \$25 for families.



And, for your convenience, we are now accepting credit and debit cards, plus other methods of electronic payment, for our meals, t-shirts, dues, and donations. Also, if you have not paid your chapter annual dues (\$30 for single or family membership) we will accept payment for that also.

And, remember, we will have our two flight simulators up and running. We just added a T-6 Texan, a P-51 and a Spitfire to the options, so perhaps you'll want to take one for a spin around the circuit, old chap.

There will be a short business meeting at 11:45, followed by our program beginning at 12:00 noon.

Our program for January will be presented by chapter member Cris Ferguson. He will speak on designing, building, and flying the LR1 biplane air racer. Cris flew the LR1 when he won the 2007 National Champion Air Race for the Biplane Class.

Cris has been flying since he was 12 years old. Since then, he has accumulated more than 5,000 flight hours in 75 different aircraft ranging from a 1918 Jenny bi-plane to a Grumman US-2C Tracker. He has flown competitive aerobatics, performed in more than 80 air shows, and raced at the Reno National Championship Air Races in the Bi-Plan class and Formula One class for 20 years. Besides this, he also holds an Airframe and Powerplant mechanics certificate With Inspection Authorization.

He owned an S1-C Pitts for 22 years which he rebuilt from the wheels up. It had a highly modified engine capable of generating 230+ horsepower and he used this for airshows and air racing for many years.



His passion is building and designing experimental aircraft and race planes. This led him into the aircraft restoration business after he rebuilt a fellow racer's aircraft after it was damaged in a runway accident.

In 2000, he moved to Arkansas to help start C & H Aircraft Restoration, Inc. Projects he worked on included an AQC-6 Cabin Waco and Meyers 145 (one of only 20 in existence). Plus, he designed and built a new race plane, the LR1, for fellow race pilot Jeff Lo; it debuted at the Reno Air Races in 2003. Chris later flew the LR1 himself at Reno and won the National Championship in the Biplane class.

Additionally in years past he worked for All Coast Aircraft Recovery. In moving various types of military aircraft across the United States for museums, he gained a wealth of knowledge and expertise.

In 2011 he and his wife Margret moved to California where he worked as the Service Manager for Selway Machine Tool Company in Hayward and retired from them in 2022.

Today he lives in Yuba City and both he and his wife joined our chapter last December.

Successful Build and Fly Informational Meeting



Our chapter held its Build and Fly informational meeting on Saturday, January 20, at the hangar. EAA Chapter 1541 is partnering with the Associated Modelers of Sacramento (AMOS) to enable a group of young people to build and fly a radio-control (RC) aircraft this spring. David Long, president of the AMOS group, and several AMOS volunteers were present to provide information about building an RC airplane, and they will continue to provide technical assistance over the next months. We had a good group of kids and parents present, plus chapter volunteers, as the EAA-sponsored


initiative gets underway. The plan is to begin building sessions on Saturday, February 17, and continue sessions on the third Saturday of each month until we have an RC airplane. Then the focus will be for each young person to learn how to fly the chapter RC airplane.



The intent is for our participants to learn about aircraft structure, flight controls, aerodynamics, weight and balance, and powerplants while having a bunch of fun. The highlight of the informational meeting was when David Long, with the help of some of the young people, fired up his RC Viper jet powered airplane and ran it at high power settings while intentionally making a bunch of smoke. We also had an RC flight simulator set up so kids could try their hand at flying. It's not too late for a few more participants to join the building group.

EAA Air Academy Summer Camp Opportunity





As part of our youth scholarship program, EAA Chapter 1541 will sponsor two young people to attend individual sessions of the EAA's Air Academy summer camp to be held at Oshkosh, Wisconsin, this coming summer.

Fun and discovery combine for an experience that young people can find nowhere else at the EAA Air Academy, a series of weeklong camps designed to introduce young people ages 12-18 to the aviation world.

The chapter has reserved two slots, one for the Basic Air Academy for ages 14-15 to be held on June 28 through July 3, and one for the Advanced Air Academy for ages 16-18 to be held on July 16 through July 24. Our sponsorship provides tuition and a travel stipend for each young person. Participants

stay at the EAA Air Academy under the direction of EAA counselors for the entire session. Experienced aviation instructors help them delve into flight through studies, hands-on demonstrations, flight simulation, and other exciting activities.

We have a process of evaluation to select the best candidates for the sponsorship, but we need to hear from you to start the process.
